Welcome back. Term 3 is a very busy term. We began yesterday our daily fitness as a build up for our Cross Country event later on in the term. Please make sure your child comes prepared for the daily run. Harold from the Life Education Caravan will be visiting the school towards the end of the term; and at the beginning of August Northpower will be presenting an Electrical Safety programme to the students

The annual speech contest will be held on Wednesday 5 September, so mark that day on your calendar.

This term our inquiry focus for learning is "Making a Difference to Others." We want our children to learn about right and responsibilities - that with one comes the other. Successful communities are caring communities and children will inquire into services available in our community and the wider community and how they can make a difference and contribute. Students will investigate services for the elderly, the importance of the fire brigade, police and ambulance, the role of Maori wardens, charities and volunteers to name a few.

I am always reminding parents and caregivers about the importance of instant recall of basic facts, including timetables. Poor knowledge is a barrier for continued student progress and achievement in all areas of mathematics. As students move further up in their mathematical learning, instant recall of these facts is necessary. By the end of year 6, students should have instant recall of all multiplication/division facts and addition and subtraction facts to 20. The maths lessons at school always includes a basic fact component. However, we are finding that this is not enough. It is important that children work on these at home, so your support in helping your child learn these is valued. So often at home we practice spelling and reading (which is important!), but leave the maths...

I look forward to another positive term. Please communicate with school with any positives and the good things that are happening, and also any issues or concerns so that these can be addressed promptly.

We are trialling a different way of working so that children who need additional support with their learning, access this as quickly as possible. This service is for all families who need to seek support for their children. This is also a opportunity for families with toddlers who may have questions about their child's language development, learning progress, social and emotional wellbeing, or behaviour.

### What is happening?

We have set up Support Hubs (called Te Manawa Tahi) in various locations in your community. If you have a concern, Te Manawa Tahi has specialists available so you can discuss your concerns directly with them. Through this discussion we will determine what help may be required and identify next steps.

### How can you find us?

Te Arahi will be flying on a flag outside each Te Manawa Tahi venue.

### When is this happening?
